**Abstract:**

The core functions of the Makerere University Herbarium are teaching and research. The main research areas are in the fields of taxonomy and systematics, ecology, and ethnobotany. As the national herbarium, we also perform regular tasks including plant identification and field collections. Current projects in taxonomy and systematics are on Poaceae and Celastraceae, distribution of wild relatives of crops and the carnivorous plants research in ecology, and various projects on medicinal plants.
